








#### **Median Income**

# Poverty Estimates 2017 for Contiguous NM Counties, NM State, and US AH





#### **Unemployment by County**








### Eddy County Commuter In-migration











If you have one person or group you turn to for basic healthcare needs, where do you go most often?




How likely are you to utilize virtual physician care such as through the computer or your smart phone?






# Was there a time in the past 12 months when you needed to see a **doctor** but could not?









#### How often do you smoke, if you do?






Was there a time in the past 12 months when you needed medications but could not obtain them?

#### In your opinion, what are the top 3 health needs in your community?









- In the past five years, cancer deaths increased 3% from 164.4 to 168.9 deaths per 100,000 population



# **Drug Overdose Mortality Rates 2017**







#### **Cancer Incidence Rates – NM Counties**







